Permitting and Rebuilding

Planning and Development Services can help with the following:

- Issue Temporary Occupancy Permits for buildings.
- Provide information related to rebuilding homes like zoning, engineering and building requirements, and any permits needed to rebuild or change property layout.
- Provide rebuild packets including data regarding property site conditions, easements, rights-of-way, parcel maps, permits for sidewalks, sewers, safety assessments, rebuilding, etc.
